

Bills to Watch Health Homes for Chronically III Kids Spark Lame-Duck Battle (HR 3325) - The Advancing Care for Exceptional (ACE) Kids Act, a bill that is widely supported by children's hospitals, is running into some opposition. The bill would allow a state Medicaid program or child health plan to provide coordinated care through enhanced pediatric health homes for children who have complex medical conditions, even allowing enrollment across state lines.
