Strategies to Increase Financial Fitness with an ABLE Account

Medi-Cal Extends Full Coverage to Age 26; Restores Benefits; Encourages Developmental, Trauma Screenings Effective January 1, Medi-Cal, California's health care program for low-income individuals and families, offers full-scope coverage for adults from age 19 until they turn 26, regardless of their documentation status. Medi-Cal also will begin restoration of non-federally mandated "optional" health benefits that were cut during the last recession. The Department of Health Care Services also will begin covering payments to encourage Medi-Cal providers to administer ageappropriate developmental screenings. Read more. Resources
