New fact sheets from the National Academy for State Health Policy highlight the five most-utilized domains from the National Standards for Systems of Care for Children and Youth with Special Health Care Needs. The Standards define the core components of a comprehensive, coordinated, and family-centered system. The most-used domains are identification and assessment, access to care, transition to adult care, medical home, and community-based services and supports.
