## of Parents, Siblings Family members of children with a serious pediatric illness may have increased physical and mental health care needs, a newly published study in JAMA Network suggests. Researchers found higher rates of health care encounters, physical and mental health

diagnoses, and physical and mental health medication prescriptions among parents and siblings of children with life-threatening conditions, compared with a control group. The authors conclude that interventions to safeguard the mental and physical well-being of parents and siblings appear to be warranted. Read the article.
