Families in low-income households may be eligible for the Affordable Connectivity Program, operated by the Federal Communications Commission, which helps pay for internet service and connected devices such as laptops or tablets.

Individuals who do not have access to health insurance through their jobs can receive assistance to buy coverage through the Affordable Care Act. But current rules only consider the cost of the insurance for the employee and don't take into account the cost of insurance for spouses, partners, dependents, or other family members. The Arc, the National Health Law Program, and other advocacy groups support proposed new rules that would fix this glitch. Read
