State Clarifies EPSDT Requirements for Managed Care Health Plans In a significant step, the Department of Health Care Services has issued a letter to all Medi-Cal managed care health plans clarifying the services they are required to provide under the Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnostic and Treatment benefit. The letter addresses in detail topics such as care coordination, transportation, and dental care. The letter also reinforces the requirements that Medi-Cal members have access to information on EPSDT, and that network providers receive standardized training on EPSDT. Read the letter.
