NATIONAL POLICY

Providing Equitable Medical Care for Children at Home: Federal Law and State Policy

Pediatric home health care services are provided through state government programs that attempt to fulfill federal policy requirements, but nationwide access to such care is not yet a reality for many children with disabilities and their families. This <u>issue brief</u> identifies inconsistencies within the federal laws and provides recommendations for how states can provide accessible, high-quality pediatric home health care. New Companion Articles Reevaluate the Calculation of CYSHCN Using National Survey of Children's Health

A <u>new article</u> in *Pediatrics* examines whether there are children who may not be classified as CYSHCN through the Children with Special Health Care Needs Screener, yet experience similar health impacts and needs to CYSHCN. A key finding is that approximately 7% of children with reported health conditions and functional difficulties did not meet the CYSHCN criteria even though their needs closely resemble those of CYSHCN. The study also revealed sociodemographic disparities in groups of children who were not identified as CYSHCN using the screener. A <u>companion piece</u> explores how the expanded calculation of CYSHCN may affect policy and research related to children's health.

Webinar: Section 504 Final Rule—Protections Against Disability Discrimination in Health Care Programs

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services recently released <u>updates to Section</u> 504 of the Rehabilitation Act. The final rule strengthens protections against disability discrimination in health care programs and activities that receive federal financial assistance, including in the areas of medical treatment decision-making and providing services in the most integrated setting. In this <u>webinar</u>, National Health Law Program staff will provide an overview of the updated regulations and how they will impact people with disabilities.

Ventilator Recalls Leave Few Options for Kids with Breathing Conditions. Here's What Would Help.

California Health Report explores the impact of a recall of Philips Respironics ventilators on CYSHCN and offers advice for concerned families. Through interviews with doctors, children's advocates, and families, <u>the article</u> shares requests for changes at the federal level to better track the health of patients exposed to the recalled ventilators, provide physicians with more information on how to assess patients for potential problems caused by the devices, and provide stronger oversight of medical devices in general.
