California Children's Services Due Process Toolkit

For families of CYSHCN, navigating state health programs can be challenging. The National Health Law Program (NHeLP) created the <u>California Children's Services Due Process Toolkit</u> to help advocates, CCS beneficiaries, and families understand how to access care through the program and how to file grievances and appeals when children have been denied services. Included in the toolkit are applicable laws, regulations, policy guidance, flowcharts, advocacy tips, and an index of acronyms. This work is supported by our Foundation.

Summary of October California Children's Services (CCS) Advisory Group Stakeholder Meeting

Discussion at the October 9 meeting of the CCS Advisory Group included the monitoring of Kaiser's transition to Whole Child Model (WCM), updates on the January 2025 WCM transition (presented by Managed Care Plans and counties), WCM Managed Care Plan operational readiness, WCM program changes since implementation, recruitment for the WCM Family/Clinical Advisory Committee, transition of the Child Health and Disability Prevention Program (presented by Blue Shield of California Promise Health Plan), and revised CCS enrollment data, among other topics.
