# More California Kids with Disabilities Are Enrolled in a New Health Program, But Is It Helping?

California Health Report looks at how the rollout of a new Medi-Cal benefit called Enhanced Care Management (ECM) is going in California, including what the experience has been like for some families of CYSHCN. The program is designed to identify and close gaps in needed services, and ensure coordination across medical care, behavioral health, and social service delivery systems. So far, the results of the program have been mixed. Senior Reporter Claudia Boyd-Barrett speaks with health department officials, state children's advocacy organizations, providers, and families to examine the issue.
