# Issue Briefs: Digital Equity and Health Care

Health care became increasingly reliant on technology during the pandemic, and as that trend continues the inequity in access becomes more apparent. Two new issue briefs address possible solutions for communities that historically have lacked access.

# Report: Advancing a Roadmap for Health and Equity Data for Persons with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities

Noting the ongoing serious data gaps about the health of people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD), a newly released report from the Administration for Community Living proposes a path that would lead to a robust health monitoring system for people with I/DD in the U.S. The monitoring system would be used to inform policies, programs, and projections.
