Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services Releases Report to Congress: Best Practices in the Money Follows the Person (MFP) Demonstration

The MFP Demonstration, first authorized by Congress in the Deficit Reduction Act of 2005, has provided nearly \$6 billion to 43 states and the District of Columbia to improve access to home- and community-based services for Medicaid-eligible individuals who need long-term services and supports. This report identifies effective strategies for implementing the program's key components and features case studies of distinctive state approaches.
