NATIONAL POLICY

Senate Weighs Changes to Bill That Would Slash Medicaid; Report Shows Potential Impact

The House has passed the bill that includes major cuts to Medicaid that could affect many CYSHCN and their families, but the Senate continues to negotiate, with some Senators calling for even deeper reductions. *No Place to Hide: Children Will Be Hurt by Medicaid Cuts*, a recent report with an accompanying webinar from Manatt and our Foundation, estimates how the Congressional proposals would affect federal and state Medicaid spending, children's access and care, and, where applicable, estimated children's coverage.

Creating Workable Medicaid Policies for CMC: Environmental Scan, Upcoming Webinar

Results have just been released from an environmental scan that was conducted to support Medicaid policymakers in improving care for CMC and their families. The goal of the research,

led by <u>Academy Health's Enhancing Systems of Care for CMC Coordinating Center</u>, was to highlight challenges and opportunities in translating the concepts of CMC and family-centered health homes into practical, workable Medicaid policies. The scan also examined where current measurement tools may not fully capture the important features and outcomes of quality care for CMC. Academy Health will host a webinar on the findings. Grand Rounds: Insights from a Pediatrician Who Is Parent of a Child with Complex Needs

In a recent lecture at Stanford Pediatrics Grand Rounds, Tasha Faruqui, DO, a pediatrician at Cincinnati Children's Hospital and parent of a child with medical complexity, discussed family experiences of living with and caring for a child with complex medical needs. She noted the financial and emotional burdens this can place on families and siblings, and outlined difficulties in navigating complex care systems. Faruqui encouraged her physician colleagues to challenge their perceptions of patients with complex needs.

HEALTH CARE TRANSITION

Report to Congress Targets Better CYSHCN Transition to Adult Care; Webinar to Highlight Recommendations

In a June report to Congress, the Medicaid and CHIP Payment and Access Commission (MACPAC) offers recommendations for improving transition from pediatric to adult care for CYSHCN covered by Medicaid. The report notes the challenges experienced by CYSHCN during transition, the absence of a requirement for states to document their transition strategy, the dearth of data on this population, and the limited coordination between state Medicaid and

Title V agencies. The MACPAC's recommendations would require states to develop and implement a strategy for transitions for CYSHCN and address these challenges. This report was informed by the work of the National Alliance to Advance Adolescent Health, a partner of our Foundation. Got Transition and our Foundation will host a webinar with MACPAC staff to discuss the recommendations.

Moving to Adult Health Care: A Six-Part Toolkit

The Center for Transition to Adult Health Care for Youth with Disabilities, led by Family Voices, has developed six new toolkits in partnership with youth with developmental disabilities. The Moving to Adult Health Care toolkits help youth take the lead in health care visits, manage their health needs, know their legal rights, and make plans for moving to adult care. Each kit includes a side-by-side guide that youth and young adults can use in partnership with a health care supporter, an accessible EZ Reader, and tools or worksheets to help youth put information into action.

Report Examines How States Utilize Vital Community Health Workers

Community health workers (CHWs) are trusted members of communities who serve as intermediaries between health/social services and the community to facilitate access to services and improve the quality and cultural competence of service delivery. As state, federal, and local partners increasingly recognize the value of the CHW role, the National Academy for State Health Policy offers a state-by-state comparison of CHW models, including state definitions, certification and training, Medicaid reimbursement, other funding mechanisms, key partnerships, and state legislation.

How States Use Telehealth to Support Children with Chronic and Complex Needs

Telehealth is an important tool for improving access to care for children with chronic and complex needs. Evidence shows that the addition of telehealth-based services to comprehensive care can reduce adverse outcomes and health care costs for these children and their families. A brief from the National Academy for State Health Policy highlights state innovations and considerations for delivering care via telehealth. The authors describe the use of telehealth approaches to support primary care providers, address pediatric specialty care workforce shortages, and strengthen access to behavioral and mental health services.
